### Interim Clinical Considerations for Use of JYNNEOS and ACAM2000 Vaccines during the 2022 U.S. Monkeypox Outbreak

- The [U.S. national monkeypox vaccine strategy](#) was announced on June 28, 2022. Multiple federal agencies, including the [Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response \(ASPR\)](#), [U.S. Food and Drug Administration \(FDA\)](#), [National Institutes of Health \(NIH\)](#), and [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention \(CDC\)](#) are coordinating to implement this enhanced vaccination strategy.
- This document provides interim guidance regarding use of JYNNEOS and ACAM2000 vaccines during the monkeypox outbreak that began in the United States on May 17, 2022. This interim guidance is in addition to standard guidance and recommendations for use of these vaccines from CDC's [Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices \(ACIP\)](#).

  - Customizable template language and imagery for newsletter or website communications

  - Parent-friendly article or blog post highlighting the importance of COVID-19 vaccination for children

- **Full CDC Vaccination Record Cards** - Vaccination record cards for many recipients of COVID-19 vaccines are now full, especially for those who are over 50 and/or immunocompromised. If a vaccination card is full, the CDC recommends that a second card be completed, and the two cards stapled together. Encourage the patient to photograph both cards in case the two become separated, if possible. Both cards should be presented when vaccination history is required for travel, employment, or any other purpose requiring official, universally recognized documentation. Patients should bring both cards to future vaccination appointments for verification of vaccination history.
